



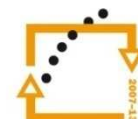

# Subject/object

## 1. People

<b>Subject</b>	<b>I</b>	<b>you</b>	<b>he</b>	<b>she</b>	<b>we</b>	<b>they</b>
Object	me	you	him	her	us	them

## 2. Things

<b>Subject</b>	<b>it</b>	<b>they</b>
Object	it	them

- We use me/us/him/them after a preposition (for/to/with):

This books aren't for you. They are for him.

Who is that girl? Why are you looking at her?

Tom and Jane are going to the theatre toning. Do you want to go with them?

Where's the newspaper? You are sitting on it!

- Give it/ them to .....me/you/him/us/them

I want that CD. Please give it to me.

Tom needs these papers. Can you give them to him, please?

# Possessive pronouns

- We use my/her/our + noun

My books      his new CD      her friend  
Our house    your computer    their garden

Its X it's

It -----) its      Dog (it) has its bone.

It's -----) it is    I like out dog. It is so cute.

I	you	he	she	it	we	they
my	your	his	her	its	our	their

## Whose is this? It's mine/yours/hers

- We use my/your/his + noun (my house/your friend/his car etc.)

My car is old.

Your house is big.

Is this his god?

- We use mine/yours/his/hers – without a noun

Is this book yours?

It's their problem, not ours!

We will go in our car and you will go in yours.

- You can use his with or without a noun:

Is this his car or hers? It's his.

- A friend of mine/ a friend of his

I went to the cinema with a friend of mine.

Jessica was in the club with a friend of hers.

Are these children friend of yours?

- Whose.....?

Whose book is this? It is yout book?/his book/their book

I	you	he	she	we	they
mine	yours	his	hers	ours	theirs

# Myself/yourself/yourselves etc.

- Me/him/them



She is talking to him.

*different people*

You never listen to me.

I didn't pay for them.

She is looking at herself.

*the same person*

I always listen to myself.

They paid for themselves.



- By myself = alone

I went to Prague by myself.

Was she there with her sister? No, she was by herself.

- Each other

I and my sister live near each other. (I live near her, she lives near me)

I	you	he	she	we	you	They
myself	yourself	himself	herself	ourselves	yourselves	themselves
