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Prehistory, read :

Prehistory divides into three main parts, the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age.

The Celts arrived from Europe around 700BC, before the coming of the Romans. One of their tribes was called the Britons, so the island was named Britannia by the Romans.

They lived in big stone or wooden huts with thatched roofs. They had many gods, and their priests were called druids.



The Celts had strong iron tools. They cleared land, farmed small, square fields, kept cattle. They made pottery and metal weapons, tools, pots and decorated them with special Celtic ornaments.

The Romans came to Britain in 43 AD and ruled for about 350 years. The Emperor Hadrian built a wall, 128km long, to protect Roman Britain against the tribes from Scotland. You can still see where Hadrian's Wall went.

The Angles and Saxons came from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands in the 5th century. They settled on the east coast of England and by 800 England was divided into seven kingdoms:

The Vikings arrived in the northern parts of the country from Scandinavia at the beginning of the 9th century. They came first as pirates, then as conquerors and finally as settlers.

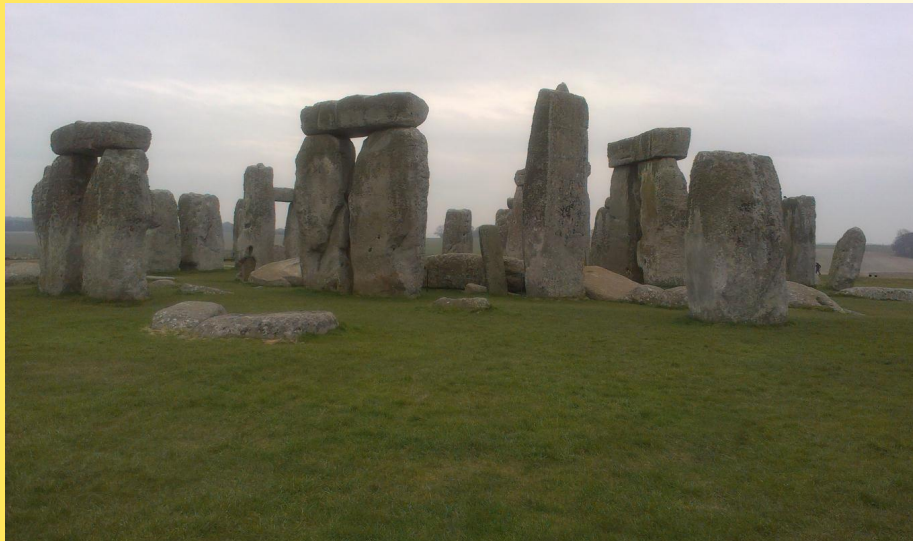


Roman farmer

The Normans from France landed in 1066. The Battle of Hastings changed the future of England. William the Conqueror became the King of England and the head of the Church. Thanks to him Britain became a powerful state.

One of the most famous prehistoric monuments in Britain is Stonehenge.

It is as old as the great pyramids of Egypt. Prehistoric people built this stone circle over 4000 years ago. It was probably used for measuring the movements of the sun and stars and for their religious ceremonies because it is orientated on the rising and setting sun.
